



STOP AND JOT TOGETHER WITH TURN AND TALK

Stop and Jot Turn and Talk

Processing content in a quick and An opportunity

Stop and jot

Important points, thoughts, reflections, questions, a paraphrase, examples or connections

An opportunity for processing content.

When stop and jot and turn and talk are used together you promote repetition (another opportunity for content to stick).

GRAFFITI CAROUSEL

Active learning while gathering and contributing to peer's thoughts.

Can be used to respond to a series of open-ended questions, problems or prompts

Use when there are several questions, multi-step problems or complex concepts.



CARTOON CONVERSATION

Can be used individually or in groups of 2-3.

Create a product interpreting concepts, people or procedures interacting in
